The classes in the following rings are open to children up to 16 years of age, see each class for age details.

Please note that large classes will be divided.

RED RING

- 10.30am** Class No. HH1 - **FIRST RIDDEN** - Riding class for children under 10 years.
Children will be asked to walk and trot individually.
- 11.30am** Class No. HH2 - **LEAD REIN** - for children aged 6 - 8 years.
- 12.30pm** Class No. HH3 - **LEAD REIN** - for children aged 3 - 5 years.
- 2.00pm** Class No. HH4 - **FANCY DRESS** - for pony and rider, any age. Riding hats must be worn.
- 3.00pm** Class No. HH5 - **RIDING CLASS** - for riders aged 10 - 12 years.
- 4.00pm** Class No. HH6 - **RIDING CLASS** - for riders aged 13 - 15 years. Riders will be asked to walk, trot & canter together.
- 5.00pm** Class No. HH7 - **PAIRS RIDING CLASS** - open to riders of any age. Pairs will be asked to do small individual show, cantering is optional.

GREEN RING

- 10.30am** Class No. HH8 - **STYLE & APPEARANCE** - for riders aged 14 - 16 years.
- 11.30am** Class No. HH9 - **STYLE & APPEARANCE** - for riders aged 11 - 13 years.
- 12.30pm** Class No. HH10 - **STYLE & APPEARANCE** - for riders aged 8 - 10 years.

Riders will be judged on how well the pony & rider are suited to each other and also on turnout. Consideration is given to how much effort the rider puts into the preparation of their pony - its not always the most immaculate pony that wins!

BLUE RING

- 11.00am - 3.30pm** Class No. HH11 - **OBEDIENT PONY**

TEST A - for riders aged 8 - 10 years.
TEST B - for riders aged 11 - 13 years.
TEST C - for riders aged 14 - 16 years.

This class will take place from 11.00am - 3.30pm. The winner of Test A will be presented with the *Power Perpetual Cup*.
